Notice to Parents
Professional Qualification of Teachers

As a parent/guardian of a student in the School Town of Highland, you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the teachers who instruct your child. Federal law allows you to ask for certain information about your child's classroom teachers, and requires us to give you this information in a timely manner. Specifically, you have the right to ask for the following information about each of your child's classroom teachers:

- Whether the Indiana Department of Education has licensed or qualified the teacher for the grades and subjects he or she teaches.
- Whether the Indiana Department of Education has decided that the teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraprofessionals provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

Student Recruiting Information

Under the general provisions in Title IX of the Federal Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), also known as the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) Act of 2001, the School Town of Highland shall provide armed forces recruiters access to students and student recruiting information.

The corporation shall provide, upon a request by military recruiters or an institution of higher education, access to high school student names, addresses, and telephone listings, referred to as directory data. A high school student or the parent of the student may request in writing that this information not be released without written parental consent.
